

Setting up your JustGiving page

The easiest and most cost-effective way to fundraise online is via JustGiving – you can also link it directly to your Twitch channel



JustGiving

Use the Sign Up button on our website or go to justgiving.com/campaign/teamtargetstreamers and click 'Start fundraising'.

Sign up or log in

Use your existing JustGiving account or sign up if you don't already have one. You can also sign up using Twitch or Facebook.

Fundraising in memory?

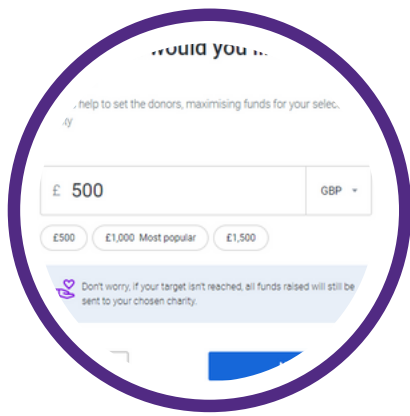
If you are fundraising in memory of a loved one or friend, select 'Yes' and fill in the requested information. If not, you can select 'No'.

Choose how you are fundraising

Choose the option most relevant to your streaming – we recommend choosing 'I'm doing my own activity'.

Add information about your stream

Here is where you can select that you are doing a 'Personal streaming/gaming event' from the dropdown, add some details about your stream and add the date of your stream (if you have decided. If not, you can always go back in and add it at a later date).



Set your fundraising target

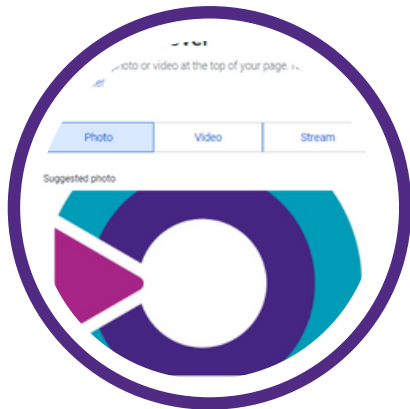
Set your target for how much you would like to raise with your livestream. If you're not sure, you can use the suggested amount and go back in to change it at a later date.

Personalise your page
